


- 1. If a class is oversubscribed, students will be chosen on the basis of their results in that subject

Course Description What is it about? What will learning be like?	The specification will give students the opportunity to study not only a wide range of literature written by home-grown Irish writers but also literature from outside the UK and literature in translation. Through independent and critical reading, students will develop their interest and enjoyment in literary studies and become accomplished, discerning readers.
	Includes a response to <i>poetry, prose</i> <i>and drama</i> and is examined through one controlled assessment and external examinations over the course of two years. The Controlled Assessment allows students to select two books of their own choosing.
	Requires and develops skills in reading, analysis and reflection. Teaching is largely discursive with a heavy weighting on research and self-motivation. Students should have the ability to write at length and be able to communicate clearly and effectively.
