

Year 11 is a fresh start: new courses, different teachers and the beginning of your two years in KS4.

Therefore, it makes sense to have a fresh start for rewards as well.



The reward system for KS4 will be as follows:

- •It will run from September in Year 11 to February in Year 12.
- •Students who achieve the thresholds below will be taken on trip organised by HOY/HOKS **'Year 12 Big Day Out'** before the half term break e.g. Vertigo, bowling, etc.

Punctuality	No more than 10 lates	
Good attendance	95-100% attendance in a single month	At least 18 SIMS attendance points awarded – 9 months meeting 95- 100%
Meet deadlines	No more than 4 behaviour points awarded for missed deadlines. (A missed deadline carries one behaviour point). Staff will issue a missed deadline behaviour point when you miss a coursework deadline.	Teachers record if a pupil has missed a coursework deadline with the behaviour point – 'KS4 / KS5 Missed Deadline'. This will be shared with your parent/carer on the school app.
Exhibit good behaviour for learning	At least 30 Achievement points awarded for behaviour for learning.	Teachers award 'KS4 Good Behaviour for Learning' points i.e. exhibit good behaviour for learning (classroom behaviour, effort, motivation, helping others, team work, answering questions, asking questions, etc.) <b>This will be shared with your parent/carer on the school app.</b>

## New Honours Award Sixth Form

The award focuses on YOU aiming for high levels in terms of attendance, punctuality, leadership and effort in your academic studies; setting you on the right path from the start of Year 13 with clear goals and expectations for sixth form.

Achieving the Honours award demonstrates that you are a dedicated member of our school community. Working towards the award will help you develop as a person and will support your applications to universities, training providers and employers.

It will also be taken into account when we are appointing our Heads of School and selecting students for the trip to Tanzania.



Before students finish Year 13 there will be a special assembly where they will be presented with their Honours tie and badge from the Principal, to wear from September of Year 14 (if they met all the criteria on the following slide).

Students will also receive an Honours Award Cup and certificate at the school's Annual Prize Distribution in October (during Year 14).

The Honours Award is the highest level of Award which can be achieved at our school.
