Working alongside a business advisor, students have created a Social Enterprise company, designed, made, and sold their own product. We investigated the market, carried out research and developed 'jars of life.'

There are 3 different categories that can be purchased, the rainy-day jar, healthy recipes, and the mental well-being jar. The jars are designed for families to help take decision making process 'out of the parents' hands.' Children choose a piece of paper with an activity or recipe on it and the decision is made for them.

The healthy recipe jars come with a recipe book that gives instructions and ingredients for each recipe and the mental well-being jar comes with an activity book with mindfulness activities included. Our products are fully recyclable and sustainable.

This term, the group attended the Young Enterprise trade fair in Castlecourt. It was a fantastic event that allowed us to generate £81 that will be used to create more products to increase profits which will all be donated to our chosen charity- cancer fund for children.

EASTER ROCKY ROAD

Ingredients


- 400 g Milk/Dark Chocolate
- 125 g Golden Syrup
- 125 g Unsalted Butter
- 100 g Mini Marshmallows
- 150 g Digestives (chopped)
- 500g Easter Chocolates
- 250 g White Chocolate



- Line a 8/9" Square tin with Greaseproof paper and leave to the side.
- In a Large bowl, add in the Chocolate, Golden Syrup, and Butter melt on a low heat in a ceramic bowl over a saucepan of simmering water, or in the Microwave on short bursts until fully melted stir until smooth! Be careful not to overheat the mixture!
- Once it's melted and combined, add in the Marshmallows, chopped biscuits, Easter Chocolates (apart from a handful) fold together pour into the tin and spread until it is even.
- Melt the white chocolate and pour over the top of the rocky road, and sprinkle over the last of the Easter Chocolates!
- Refrigerate until set, chop up, and enjoy!

Notes

- You can easily half the recipe. Store this in the fridge, and it will last for about a week!
- Use mini Creme eggs so that they are not too big in the Rocky Road.










We have had a great term in Geography as we have been learning about a range of topics: from Maps to Sustainable Development to Rivers; as well as developing our general knowledge about countries and flags!


